How We Best Care for All of Our Children

"If we want to address intergenerational poverty, we must make sure kids are graduating from high school," said Alexis Oberdorfer, vice president and chief officer of community engagement and partnerships for Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota (LSS). "Eighty-eight percent of students who fail to earn their high school diploma were not reading proficiently at the end of third grade."

Addressing the 2022 Saint Paul Area Synod Assembly, Oberdorfer emphasized the importance of early childhood education and intervention. She outlined 10 categories of Adverse Childhood Experiences (such as physical abuse, neglect or household dysfunction like mental illness, domestic violence, or an incarcerated relative) that have a profound lifelong impact on a child's brain and body. We encourage you to watch the video below of her presentation, "How We Best Care for All of Our Children." It is a powerful message of how early intervention can change the future for a child, a family and a community.

LSS is partnering with the synod for The Planting Hope Campaign with the Families Together Preschool on the Eastside of St. Paul. Oberdorfer said, "If we want to take a look at where we're going long-term, we know that we need high quality early childhood education programs that serve some of our most vulnerable kids. Where better to do it than the East Side of St. Paul?"



Planting Hope Financial Update

Just as our garden beds and farm fields are flush with new growth, financial commitments toward the \$2.75 million goal for the Planting Hope campaign continue to rise. At the end of June, we have received over \$550,000 in statements of intent from synod leaders, synod staff and 14 congregations. We are certain that more congregations have set goals and focused fundraising efforts on the Planting Hope campaign than the 14 congregations which have reported in their results. 

Christian Nationalism: Why It Matters and How We Can Respond Monday, Aug. 1 - 6:30-8:30 p.m. | All Saints, Eagan & Zoom

American Christians have always struggled with the relationship between church and state. But in recent years the alignment between right-wing politics and Christianity has taken on a new intensity in a movement called "Christian Nationalism." This power grab co-opts the language and symbols of Christianity, deceiving many and harming both our



faith and democracy. (Christian nationalism strongly influenced the Jan. 6, 2021, riot in Washington, D.C.). How do we as Lutherans understand this movement and respond to it? Pastor Rolf Olson and Dr. Nancy Koester will give a one-night, two-part presentation on this dangerous development. Part 1 explains what "Christian Nationalism" is and why it matters; Part 2 explores who's involved in Christian nationalism, what are its components, and ways we can respond.
