A message from Pastor Aaron:

Siblings in Christ,

Nina Simone once sang:

It's a new dawn
It's a new day
It's a new life
For me
And I'm feeling good



I pray you and I are all feeling good in this new year of 2023. In all truth, the first time I remember hearing this song was on one of those Starbucks' Holiday CDs that my sister used to collect. It seems a bit strange for a festive winter compilation but I really didn't know its history as a musical number from a British play class, or its emancipation overtones in Simone's version during the Civil Rights movement. This song came to mind today because I am writing this newsletter for Epiphany, Ordinary Time, and Lent, during the season of Advent with Christmas on the horizon. Trying to encompass all of those themes and different contexts can be difficult, yet there are some songs and words that can transcend time and imbue each situation with meaning.

The newness of life we experience through God's grace each and everyday is one of those things that just fits regardless of time and place. If Advent is a season of waiting for Christ to come, the holy day of Epiphany is celebrating that appearance. This time of revelation and celebration is followed by Lent. A season often associated with more somber tones, the word itself actually means "Spring." So whether we are singing praises to God's manifested presence here on earth, or lamenting our sin with ash and apologies, we carry a feeling of newness into each and every encounter of worship.

Nevertheless I want to explore new opportunities and activities in the months and seasons ahead. In the end as we practice our faith together in traditions new and old, I look forward to this first quarter of 2023 and I'm feeling good.
