#### A Message from Pastor Aaron:

Siblings in Christ,

Are you ready for a revival? To be completely honest I had NO plans to write that question till my hands typed it, and yet I feel as if it's the question I need to run with... hard to say no to the Holy Spirit when they show up with a question.

I must admit, I tend to be more pragmatic and skeptical of revivalist movements, making me even more surprised that this is the way this newsletter is going to go. So, let's explore together, shall we?

Revivalism within the history of Christianity brings to my mind the Great Awakening movement accompanied by the puritanical preachings of George Whitefield, the great camp meetings with day long prayer and worship services, or the Billy Graham crusades of the 1950s. Which, for all their pros and cons, are not really my cup of tea (I prefer coffee anyway).

So, what would a revival look like at Salem Lutheran Church in West St. Paul? New members, revitalized youth program, new energy around projects and events, a better sense of mission, a greater feeling of community, a stronger relationship with God?

How about all the above? The good news is, I don't think we need the fire and brimstone preaching of Rev. Whitefield or the stadium filled altar calls of Billy Graham to accomplish these things. We need God, and God is already here.

In the last half of 2023, we have so many wonderful opportunities embrace the gifts that God has given us here. Starting in October we have our four-week SLC Pledge Drive. We are going to have fun and pay respectful homage to the well-trod pledge drives of PBS and NPR, yet at the heart of this endeavor we are going to be celebrating all that is made possible through the financial support of so many members in this community. We are ripe for a revival because of the support and steady offering this congregation receives year in and year out and for that I am incredibly grateful.

Much like this newsletter which started with a question I never expected to write, I am incredibly energized by the potential that is present here and I pray you are too. God's up to something and I am eager for us to find out what that is!

#### From the Council President:

Salem Friends,

We have had an incredible busy Summer. Salem has been active within the congregation, within the local community, and globally. The Summer VBS was a huge success. Thanks to all who worked on this effort. We had a good turn-out for National Night Out with lot of involvement by Salem folks. The dedication of our new labyrinth came about through the commitment and efforts of many people. Special thanks to Elaine Hause for envisioning this project and shepherding it through. Community members are already using the labyrinth.

The River Heights Chorale, Klondike Kate's, and Dakota Square Dancers are back at Salem and the Choir and Handbell Choirs are back rehearsing. Salem is alive with the sound of music!

A major highlight of the summer was our Mission Trip to Magome, Tanzania. Fifteen people went on this Mission Trip – 11 of them were Salem folks. We spent a lot of time with our companion congregation in Magome and our sponsored students. Because of Salem members' generosity we were able to bring many gifts, a computer, school supplies, medical supplies, blankets, quilts, caps, jerseys/shorts, and more, not only to the Magome church and preaching points but also to the Magome primary school, the Magome clinic, the Huruma Orphanage, and several secondary schools in the area. Pastor Agripa and the Magome congregations extended their thanks and appreciation to us at a moving farewell ceremony.

Especially gratifying was the way Salem's teenagers and young adults interacted (and played and sang) with the kids and adults of every site we visited. They showed the love of God to all they met. What a special blessing it was to have them with us on our Mission trip to Magome.

We recently packed 48 care bags for persons experiencing homeless at "God's Work, Our Hand". What a testament to Salem's engagement in the community. To help distribute these bags, you can pick up a care bag or two in the office and hand them out to anyone you may see in need of help.

Other events included an evening sing-along around bonfires, gatherings and excursions of the O.W.L.S. (Older Wiser Lutherans at Salem) and the start of a 5-part Saturday morning Old Testament Bible Study led by Pastor Aaron (details on pg. 18).

Under the leadership of Bekah Elling we have developed an "Abuse Prevention Policy and Program" to help protect our kids and young people as well as vulnerable adults. This comprehensive policy and program was recently adopted by the Council.

The council has also approved a recommendation to congregations by the Synod Assemble to revise congregational Constitutions to make them more diverse, equitable and inclusive. The congregation will vote on these changes at the Annual Meeting.

Coming up are a Trunk or Treat, a "Beer, Burgers, and Hymns" night at Gallagher's, and Advent season activities! (details on pgs. 15-17)

As we move enthusiastically ahead into the Fall toward Advent, we rejoice in a sound financial status, a terrific and professional staff and an energized congregation. God has been good to us.

#### From the Parish Nurse, Debbie Lee:

#### "AN OUNCE OF PREVENTION IS WORTH A POUND OF CURE"

There are many people who skip their preventative visits and only see a doctor when they are sick. However, we could alleviate some of the strain on our health care system by taking advantage of an annual physical, yearly flu and COVID-19 shots, blood pressure screenings, mammograms, not to mention the dreaded colonoscopy.

Some screenings such as dental health, mental health, memory and depression screenings are an important part of preventative medicine as well. Knowing your family history and health risks may help decide which health screenings are a priority for you as many diseases have a genetic component, such as heart disease, diabetes, breast and colon cancer.

Finally, things we may not consider as preventative medicine are home safety, medication management, stress management, diet and exercise since these affect our physical health.

We will be having a Fourth Sunday in Advent Worship Service at the regular 9:30 am worship time.


