Worship in an Inviting Church

Saturday, March 22 - 9 a.m.-3 p.m. | Trinity, Stillwater

Ponder, practice and experience worship for a new day! All congregations across the synod are encouraged to send rostered ministers, musicians, tech teams and others involved with worship planning to attend this event.



We'll talk about how to welcome new faces, what makes for vibrant worship in today's world, and how to balance remaining true to our Lutheran identity with experimentation and other traditions. It's a great opportunity to reflect on your current congregation's worship context...and imagine what it could be.

Bishop Patricia Lull will kick off the day with a deep dive on worship and its importance for congregational vitality and inviting others into life in Christ. The day includes workshops (see below), lunch and a closing worship. The cost is \$25 per person, which includes lunch.

Embodied Hospitality: Sacred Spaces & Faces of Welcome

Our church buildings and body of Christ convey messages of welcome. Learn simple strategies to foster an environment, both architectural and relational, that create a positive lasting impression.





Embodied Hospitality comes in many forms: prayer, food, follow-up, faces and spaces. At this workshop, you'll discover practical tips to enhance your welcoming presence to both visitors and members. **Presenters:** The Rev. Can Technology Be An Open Invitation Into Worship?

Participants will be asked to reflect on existing opportunities in their congregation's worship and consider if technology might be part of their next steps. We will share an overview of creative ways to





use screens, videos and other technology to invite people into renewed worship experiences. How might technology be an opportunity to expand ministries, invite outsiders, and help worshippers engage more fully in vibrant worship? **Presenters:** Deacon Nina Joygaard and Tech Team Leader Daniel Diemer (Faith, Forest Lake)

Contemporary Worship in a Lutheran Key

Just starting a contemporary worship service or want to improve the one you have? This workshop will equip you with the basics for structuring a service using a contemporary musical and liturgical form, while staying consistent with Lutheran theology.





Participants will learn skills for leading worship that engages the congregation, explore resources for music and liturgical texts, and gain an overview of what makes a worship service "Lutheran." **Presenters:** Sara Renner (St. Andrew's, Mahtomedi), Nate Crary (Christ the King, New Brighton)

Young Adult Travel Grants

Thanks to funding through the synod's Planting Hope Campaign, grants are now available for young adults who are planning trips with their congregations to visit companions in Guatemala and Tanzania. Applicants ages 16-35 are invited to apply for funds of up to half the total cost of their travel.



Global partnerships have provided life-changing experiences for many in our synod and the grants are a way to make those experiences more accessible to young people. Who Can Vote at Synod Assembly?

Synod Assembly voting members include both rostered ministers serving under call (in congregations or in specialized ministry) and lay voters elected by their congregations, typically during the congregation's annual meeting. At Synod Assembly, voting members may make decisions about governance, mission and finances, as well as



elect members of Synod Council or other committees. These voters are not designated "representatives" of a congregation (like elected officials), but they are asked to take seriously the responsibility of voting with their conscience for the well-being of the synod. Besides voting members, assembly registrations may also include:

- Retired Rostered Ministers These participants are allowed to address the
 assembly during proceedings, but may not cast a vote. [Unless they are one of
 the retirees elected at the 2025 Retired Minister Caucus, retired rostered
 ministers have "voice" but no "vote."]
- Advisors These participants are allowed to address the assembly during
 proceedings, but may not cast a vote. They include rostered ministers not
 under call (ie. on leave, retired or in study) except for those selected as voting
 members, lay synod staff, lay members of synod assembly committees,
 representatives of synod partners in ministry, representatives from the ELCA
 synod and churchwide offices. [Advisors have "voice" but no "vote"]
- Visitors These participants are attending assembly as observers due to a
 personal interest in a topic or as participants in the mission fair. [Visitors have
 neither "voice" nor "vote."]

Assembly business takes place on two days this year! The business of the assembly begins on Friday, May 16, at 7 p.m. and will include elections and deliberations on resolutions and memorials, as well as the Churchwide representative's presentation. The assembly reconvenes on Saturday, May 17, at 8:30 a.m. for more business, festive worship and Dr. Lois Malcolm's keynote address. A mission fair featuring work groups, ministry partners and affiliated organizations is open on Friday from 5-7 p.m. and on Saturday through the lunch break. Under this year's assembly theme of "Called to Invite," we'll be exploring what it means for each of us to be a witness to life in Christ. Online registration is open through May 2; atthe-door registration begins at 5 p.m. on May 16.

Summer Internships

We know there are some additional promising young adults out there so we're extending the application deadline to March 24 for the synod's summer internship program. Applications are still being reviewed as they are submitted so the sooner the better to apply!



Up to 10 interns will serve at sites that focus on feeding the hungry,

working with refugee/immigrant populations, social work, working with children, community gardening or working with the elderly. The interns will receive a \$4,000 stipend, funded by the synod's Planting Hope Campaign, while working 20-24 hours per week, June 9-Aug. 22. The interns will also meet weekly as a group for learning, conversation and worship. Please share the news about this great program that provides young people a meaningful summer work experience, along with an opportunity to learn, serve and reflect. Pastor Bristol Reading, who serves as the pastor at St. Luke in St. Paul, will again coordinate this program. Learn more.





Deletion of Facebook Live Videos



If your congregation streams its worship services or other activities as live videos on Facebook and uses that platform as your sole archive, take note! Facebook will soon begin deleting live videos older than 30 days. If you want to keep those past recordings, you will need to download them and find an alternate storage system. You can download videos one by one in your activity log on your profile or you can download them all at once. Click here for details about the new policy and download instructions from Facebook.

Facebook says they will notify you via email and on your Facebook page about when this change will take place for your account. Once you're notified, you'll have 90 days to download your live videos or transfer them to cloud storage. Two common options for video hosting are YouTube and Vimeo. Mental Health Faith Forum

Saturday, May 3 - 9 a.m.-12:30 p.m. | Trinity, Stillwater

This event helps empower communities to support addiction and mental health recovery. You'll hear inspiring talks from



experts and advocates and updates from state policymakers, visit informative exhibits, and be part of the launch of a new *Our Stigma* podcast. (The podcast will offer an informational and emotional exploration of mental health and addiction stigma across various faith communities and cultures. An accompanying study resource will also be launched and copies will be available at this event.)

The Mental Health Faith Forum features faith community leaders, Minnesota state policymakers and mental health/addiction experts sharing their expertise in an educational setting. The event includes cultural programming, speakers, and a large Q&A session. Indigenous, Hmong, East African, and African American presenters will all contribute to the discussion. The keynote speaker is social media influencer Kody Green, who has overcome challenges that include addiction, incarceration and serious mental health struggles. Registration is \$15 per person.
