Bishop's Theological Conference

This event is for rostered ministers for pastors and deacons in the Saint Paul Area Synod, including those who are retired. The Bishop's Theological Conference is a time for study, worship, unstructured time and abundant conversations.



Under the theme of Faithfulness, Courage and Hope in the Face of Tyranny, the Rev. Heidi Neumark will lead us in discussions about tyranny in the times of Isaih and today, alongside Isaiah's poetry of hope in the face of such realities. Pastor Neumark serves Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kingston, NY. She was a founding member of South Bronx Churches, an ecumenical community organizing group that trained local leaders, built hundreds of low-cost homes, and established a top-ranked public high school. Rev. Neumark is the author of three books, including *Sanctuary: Being Christian in the Wake of Trump*.

Members of the Bishop Election Committee will also be present at the conference for a listening session as we prepare for a new synod bishop in 2026. The conference registration is \$525 for a single room and \$475 for a double (additional fees when paying by credit card).

Addressing Hunger:

Impact of SNAP Cuts

Perhaps you, like many of us, have been overwhelmed with all that is included in the "Big, Beautiful" bill passed by our federal representatives and senators and



signed by President Trump. I hope you have been paying special attention to how this legislation will affect many Americans who depend on SNAP funding to supplement their diets and daily lives.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides food benefits to low-income families to supplement their grocery budgets and is the largest federal nutrition assistance program. Work requirements have been extended effective immediately and there are likely 150,000 Minnesotans who will find they need to work 20 hours per week to retain their SNAP benefits. When the full implementation of the bill comes later, that number can increase to 450,000 Minnesotans.

While other reductions and rules will not take effect until after the 2026 elections, they are going to be significant and will make hunger and food insecurity even worse...not only here in Minnesota, but all around the country. States will be asked to pick up more of the losses and certainly food shelves and people of faith will be asked to provide even more than ever before.

Second Harvest just provided **this helpful link** to help you understand how the "Big Beautiful" bill impacts SNAP. I recommend you read it and share it with your congregations. It will help you understand what is happening to our neighbors and God's hungry children.

Safe Gun Storage

This session is for all parents and caregivers who want to protect the children and teens entrusted to us. Led by a dedicated parent and South Metro volunteer for the Be SMART campaign, this nonpartisan and non-legislative presentation provides simple, practical tools to foster safer homes, schools and meaningful conversations. The Be SMART framework encourages us to:

- · secure all guns in our homes and vehicles,
- model responsible behavior,
- · ask about unsecured guns in other homes,
- · recognize the role guns can play in suicide, and
- tell others to Be SMART.

By embracing these steps, we uphold our commitment to the well-being of our youth, reflecting our values of integrity and care. Together, we can empower families to take simple but powerful actions that save lives and protect the future of our children.
